Danielle Way

University of Western Ontario

Dr. Danielle Way is an expert and leader in forest ecophysiology who uses innovative and interdisciplinary approaches to understand how plants acclimate their physiological responses to increases in global temperature. Her research provides important information for predicting the impact of global climate change on forest ecosystems. Since her appointment as a faculty member at Western University in 2012, she has been extremely productive, procuring over \$3 million in research funding, establishing 11 international collaborations and producing over 40 publications. Dr. Way has earned worldwide recognition and her expertise is highly sought. In the last seven years she has been invited to give 35 invited presentations in national and international meetings, participate in 7 international global climate change workshops, contribute to the writing of 5 significant reviews and serve in significant editorial positions in major journals of her field. Her work has been cited over 3000 times with 8 articles listed in the Web of Science as ISI Highly Cited Papers and an h-index of 27. Recently, she was elected a member of the Royal Society of Canada College of New Scholars, Artists and Scientists. The CSPB/SCBV is delighted to honour Danielle Way as the 2019 recipient of the C.D.
